The Program: This degree is designed to allow students to tailor their education to meet specific career goals in secondary school teaching, behavior analysis, interpersonal relationships skills, and graduate school preparation. A human services/caseworker training option may also be available to majors.

Admission Requirements: Either an associate's degree in an appropriate discipline or completion of general education requirements (general education must be completed to be admitted to advanced standing to take these classes). Transfer credit or previous coursework must be evaluated before admission is approved. To be a psychology major, a student must make written application to the department, after meeting the following prerequisites: 1. complete at least 40 semester credits with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher; 2. complete at least 18 credits of the University Studies requirements with a GPA of 2.75 or higher; and 3. complete PSY 1010, 1100, 1400, 1410 and with a GPA of 2.75 or higher. Application to the department should be made during the semester in which these prerequisites will be completed.

Graduation Requirements: A minimum of 120 semester hours, 47 hours in Psychology with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75. Fulfill USU general education requirements. Students must also have a minor in a complimentary area. See Advisor for details.

Real Time Requirements: This program has an apprenticeship component. See advisor for details. USU's EDNET and satellite classes require students to attend class at a designated time in one of the university's 80 education centers across the state (see <http://extension.usu.edu/conted/campuses/index.htm> for locations).

Required Courses: USU offers classes online, by Independent Study and CD-ROM, and broadcast on EDNET and satellite to receive sites across the state. See grid below for details.
