Program Description: This program is designed to prepare students for employment in the professions that promote health care and prevent diseases. Course work emphasizes the development of skills required of the entry-level educator: assessing needs, planning effective programs, implementing programs, evaluating effectiveness of programs, coordinating services, acting as a resource person, and communication of needs and concerns.

Admission Requirements: An associate's degree in an appropriate discipline with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5. Students may need to take pre-specialization business classes, then apply for advanced standing in the College of Health Professions. Transfer credit or previous coursework must be evaluated before admission is approved. Students wishing to transfer less than 30 credits must submit high school transcripts, ACT/SAT scores, and an admissions application.

Graduation Requirements: A minimum of 120 semester credits hours (at least 25 must be taken within the health promotion courses) with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 (must have a 2.5 average in Major courses). Students must fulfill WSU's general education requirements. Students must take at least 30 credits from WSU. ix months prior to graduation or after, a student can decide to take the national test and become a Certified Health education Specialist (CHES).
